QUESTIONS PAPER FORMAT AND MARKING SCHEME:

SCIENCE (16 Questions, 40 Marks)

Section – A (3 Questions, 1 Mark Each)

- Chemistry – 1 Questions (This question can be based on any of the following type. MCQ, VSA, Assertion-Reason).
- Biology – 1 Questions (This question can be based on any of the following type. MCQ, VSA, Assertion-Reason).
- Physics – 1 Question (This question can be based on any of the following type. MCQ, VSA, Assertion-Reason).

3 questions are based on paragraph type. Each question consist of a paragraph which will have 5 sub-parts [A student will attempt any 4 sub-parts out of 5]

Among these 3, 1 question will be from Physics, 1 question each from Biology and Chemistry.

MATHS (20 Questions, 40 Marks)

Part – A: This consists of 2 sections i.e. Section-A and Section-B

Section – A (8 questions, 1 mark each):

Section – A has 8 questions. Internal choice is given in any 3 questions. These 8 questions are based on very short answer type.

Section – B (2 questions, 4 mark each): Section – B has 4 case study-based questions. Each case study has 2 case-based sub-parts. Out of 5 sub-parts, student will attempt any 4.

2 questions, 2 marks each – Internal choice is given in any 1 questions.

5 questions, 3 marks each – internal choice is given in any 2 questions.

SCIENCE (36 Questions, 80 Marks)

Section – A (20 Questions, 1 Mark Each)

Chemistry – 5 Questions (2 questions are VSA, 2 questions are MCQ, 1 question is assertion-reason type)
Biology – 5 Questions (3 questions VSA, 2 questions are assertion-reason type).
Physics – 6 Questions (6 questions VSA type)

4 questions are based on paragraph type. Each question consist of a paragraph which will have 5 sub-parts [A student will attempt any 4 sub-parts out of 5]

Among these 4, 2 questions will be from Physics, 1 question each from Biology and Chemistry.
